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Isolation and Quarantine (Staff & Students)

The District will work with the BCHD & Berrien RESA to support a robust case investigation and contact tracing process. The District will provide educational support for students and families who are impacted by isolation and quarantine. Isolation and quarantine will adhere to local public health requirements and operating procedures. Close contact identification will be supported by the school for classroom and athletic-based close contact identification.

NOTES: Close contact exclusion will be determined by current school operations and policies currently in place for masking and social distancing. For example:

- → While No Masks are Required. Close contacts within 6 ft of a positive individual will be quarantined for 10 days from the last date of contact. Fully vaccinated individuals **do not** quarantine unless the individual displays symptoms.
- → While Face Masks are Required. Close contacts within 3 ft of a positive individual will be quarantined for 10 days from the last date of contact. Individuals 3 to 6 ft may continue to attend school as long as they do not have symptoms. Fully vaccinated individuals **do not** quarantine unless the individual displays symptoms.
